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4 **GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF**
5 **AUTHORIZED BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL**

6 Given the COVID-19 public health emergency, the Superior Court of Contra Costa
7 County (“Court”) previously requested emergency authorizations from Chief Justice Tani G.
8 Cantil-Sakauye, as Chair of the Judicial Council of California, pursuant to Government Code
9 section 68115. On March 13, 2020, the Chief Justice granted this request and issued an
10 emergency order, which this Court implemented on the same day, and which was effective
11 through April 1, 2020. At the Court’s request, the Chief Justice issued further orders permitting
12 the Court to extend certain relief through and including April 28, 2020, May 28, 2020, and July
13 2, 2020, respectively, which the Court implemented.

14 Because emergency conditions continue to exist, the Court renewed its request. Now,
15 exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the further July 1,
16 2020, Order of the Chief Justice, this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

- 17 1. The time period provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within
18 which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be released
19 from custody is extended to not more than five days, applicable only to minors for
20 whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from July 3, 2020 to July 30,
21 2020, inclusive; and
22 2. The time period provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within
23 which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be given a
24 detention hearing is extended to not more than five days, applicable only to minors for
25 whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from July 3, 2020 to July 30,
26 2020.
