GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Given the COVID-19 public health emergency, the Superior Court of Contra Costa County ("Court") previously requested emergency authorizations from Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, as Chair of the Judicial Council of California, pursuant to Government Code section 68115. On March 13, 2020, the Chief Justice granted this request and issued an emergency order, which this Court implemented on the same day, and which was effective through April 1, 2020. At the Court's request, the Chief Justice issued multiple further orders permitting the Court to extend certain relief, which the Court implemented.

Because emergency conditions continue to exist, the Court renewed its request. Now, exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the further December 23, 2020, Order of the Chief Justice, this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS**:

- 1. The time period provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody is extended to not more than five days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from December 23, 2020, through January 21, 2021, inclusive; and
- 2. The time period provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing is extended to not more than five days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from December 23, 2020, through January 21, 2021, inclusive.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
